


Figure E1. Age demography of elderly respondents in UK (a) and Belgium (b).




Figure E2. Age of informal carer respondents in UK (a) and Belgium (b).




Figure E3. Age of elderly people cared for by informal carer respondents in UK (a) and Belgium (b).




Figure E4. Number of hours of informal care received by elderly people in UK (a) and Belgium (b).






Figure E5. Distance of elderly people from informal carers in UK (a) and Belgium (b).

**Figure E8.** Innovations used currently (blue bars) or in the future (orange bars) by informal carers in the UK (a) and Belgium (b).





Figure E9. Ways in which elderly people identify that they have unmet needs in UK (a) and Belgium (b).



**Figure E10**. Ways in which informal carers identify that the elderly person they care for and/or they as carers have unmet needs in UK (a) and Belgium (b).




Figure E11. Barriers to innovation for the elderly people in the UK (a) and Belgium (b).







Figure E12. Barriers to innovation for informal carers in the UK (a) and Belgium (b).




